

## SECTION 11: BASKETBALL

Rules in this section shall pertain to both boys' and girls' basketball unless otherwise specified.

### 11.2 CONTEST LIMITS

#### 11.2.1 **Pre-Season:**

1. A team shall be limited to two (2) pre-season scrimmages.
2. A team shall be limited to one (1) jamboree.

#### 11.2.2 **Season:** A team shall be limited to the following:

1. Classes 5A-1A – 19 games plus three (3) tournaments or 18 games plus four (4) tournaments
2. Classes B&C – 25 games plus six (6) tournaments
3. A team shall be limited to three (3) games per day during a tournament.

#### 11.2.3 **School Day Contest:** A school shall not compete during instructional time (*Monday-Friday*) during the regular season. This rule is explained in by-laws in Section 9: "Athletics and Instructional Time." This rule shall be waived for the state playoffs.

#### 11.2.4 **Waiver:** To decide a tie in district standings, the following limitations shall be waived for a school:

1. Total number of regular-season games played
2. The fewest possible games shall be played to decide a district tie.

### 11.3 GENERAL

#### 11.3.1 Schools shall compete in Classes 5A, 4A, 3A, 2A, 1A, B, and C in boys' and girls' basketball and shall compete in districts as adopted by the LHSAA Executive Committee. In all classes basketball districts may be separate from the other sports' districts.

#### 11.3.2 Schools shall submit an online version of their boys' and girls' basketball schedule to the LHSAA by the deadline cited in Rule 11.1, Important Dates, in this section. Only games shown on this schedule shall be counted as official games for state championship team qualifying. If a school adds a varsity basketball game(s) to its schedule after the deadline cited in Rule 11.1, Important Dates, the additional game(s) shall not be counted when determining power points for either school.

#### 11.3.3 "Home team" players shall wear **white jerseys** and "visiting teams" players shall wear dark-colored jerseys in varsity games.

#### 11.3.4 The coaching box shall be outlined outside the side of the court on which the scorer and timer's table and team benches are located. The area shall be bounded by a line 28' from the end line, the sideline, and a line 14' from the end line and the team bench. These lines shall be located off the court, be two inches wide, and of a color contrasting with the boundary lines.

#### 11.3.5 Basketball courts whose width is less than the maximum width, such that a properly drawn three point semicircle line actually intersects with and ends at the sideline, shall not be illegal courts due to the location of the three point line for regular season games only.

#### 11.3.6 During the playing of all basketball contests, spectators shall not be allowed to stand in any area that outlines the playing court. All spectators shall be seated in the stands during the playing of all basketball games.

#### 11.3.7 If a school's football team has a state playoff game scheduled on Friday night conflicts with the school's scheduled basketball game(s), it shall be permitted, by mutual agreement of the opposing school principal, to reschedule the basketball game(s) on a school night during the same week provided it is not a tournament game. If it is a tournament game, it shall require approval of both the host school and opposing school principals to reschedule the game on an earlier date. In either case, the opposing school shall be allowed to honor this playing date change without penalty.

#### 11.3.8 Schools scheduled to play boys' and girls' basketball games on Monday and/or Tuesday of the 20<sup>th</sup> calendar week in conflict with the Boys' and Girls' State Cross Country Meet may mutually agree to play on Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday.

1. If any school scheduled to compete in the state cross country meet on Monday cannot mutually agree to play on Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday, then it shall be required to play its game on Tuesday of the 20<sup>th</sup> calendar week.
2. If any school scheduled to compete in the state cross country meet on Tuesday cannot mutually agree to play on Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday, then it shall be required to play its game on Monday of the 20<sup>th</sup> calendar week.

**11.4 REPORTING WEEKLY GAME RESULTS ONLINE**

- 11.4.1** Beginning the first playing date of the season, the principal or his/her designee of every school shall report to the LHSAA office via the LHSAA Members' Only website [www.lhsaaonline.org](http://www.lhsaaonline.org) by 4:00 p.m. each Monday its varsity **boys' and girls'** basketball game results for the previous week **to include the date, opponent, opponent's division, and the result of the game including tournament games. Unless disputed by 4:00 p.m. that day, the results shall stand as posted.**
- 11.4.2** On the date that district representatives are named, the principal or his/her designee of every school in every district of every class shall report the results of any contest played during that week no later than 10:00 p.m.

**11.5 DISTRICT PLAY**

- 11.5.1** Each district committee and all districts' schools shall comply with constitutional provisions regarding competition within the district. This requirement is explained in the constitution in Section 6: "District Affairs."
- 11.5.2** As long as the LHSAA's constitution is not violated, a district shall determine its own method for determining first and second place team representatives in state playoffs by the deadline cited in Rule 11.1, "Important Dates" in this section. Failure to name a representative(s) by the deadline may result in a school(s) being omitted from the state playoffs. Additional days to certify a district's playoff representatives shall not be allowed.
- 11.5.3** Before a district-basketball-game-forfeit can be official, the forfeit shall be approved by a simple majority vote of the district's voting principals. All principals in the district shall be afforded an opportunity to vote.

**11.6 REPORTING TEAMS FOR PLAYOFF COMPETITION**

- 11.6.1** The district chairperson shall report the name of the first and second place teams on the official *LHSAA District Chairperson Certification Form* to the LHSAA by 10:00 p.m. on the deadline cited in Rule 11.1, "Important Date" in this section. The district chairperson(s) is asked to certify records for **all teams** in the district on this form by including the following information:
1. The district, class, overall record, and district finish
  2. District playoff games, out-of-state games, Hall of Fame games, and sub-varsity games do not count in the won-loss record and should not be listed on the official form
- 11.6.2** Only those schools that automatically qualify for the state playoffs shall submit the official *LHSAA District Final Standings Form* by 10:00 p.m. of the deadline cited in Rule 11.1, Important Dates, in this section. The form must be verified and signed by the head coach and the school's principal. Failing to submitted the required information by the established deadline dates shall exclude a team from wildcard consideration, and the school shall be fined \$100 per occurrence, per sport. Forms submitted by email shall only be accepted from the principal, athletic director, or the coach's registered email address listed on the contact information portion of the LHSAA Members' Only website.
- 11.6.3** If a team qualifies and fails to submit the required information on the official form accurately, timely and properly signed, it shall be in the lowest position.

**11.7 WILDCARD PROGRAM**

**11.7.1** Wildcard teams shall be allotted to each class as follows:

- 11.7.2** If a school wishes to withdraw its team from the playoffs, the school's principal shall submit a signed statement to the LHSAA Executive Director requesting to not be placed on the bracket no later than 10:00 p.m. on the deadline date for naming district representatives cited in Rule 11.1, Important Dates, in this section.
- 11.7.3** If a school fails to withdraw its team from the playoffs and is placed on the bracket and the team withdraws or forfeits its bi-district playoff game, then the school shall be fined \$1,000.00. The LHSAA shall retain 10% of the fine and the offended team shall receive 90% of the fine. The game shall count as a forfeit and shall be considered as a home game for the team receiving the forfeit.
- 11.7.4** Criteria for wildcard selection shall be as follows:
1. Only the teams certified as the first and second place district representative shall automatically qualify for the state playoffs.
  2. The remainder of the byes on the bracket will be filled with the wildcard teams (teams that did not automatically qualify) using the highest power ranking in descending order to fill the bracket.
- 11.7.5** Wildcard Selection Committee:
1. After the established deadline for reporting teams for playoff competition, schools shall have 24 hours to review the power rankings which shall be posted on the LHSAA website.
  2. A request to correct a school's won-loss record or appeal or dispute the power ranking of an individual school must be submitted in writing by the principal between 8:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon on the Monday of the Wildcard Selection Committee Meeting.
  3. A committee consisting of the Executive Director, an LHSAA Assistant Executive Director, two members of the Executive Committee, and two members of the LHSCA shall meet on the Monday following the last playing date to verify the wildcard teams and complete the playoff brackets.
  4. After 12:00 noon, the official brackets shall be posted. Once the brackets are adopted and posted on the LHSAA website, the plan becomes final and no changes will be made.
  5. This Committee shall have the authority to make all rulings necessary and be prepared to apply the intent of the rules governing the wildcard program and any situations which may not be covered by the rules.
- 11.7.6** Determining Power Rating:
1. The power rating for each school shall be determined as follows:

Win (5 Points)	Plus Opponents Win (100%)
Lose (0 points)	Plus Opponents Win (33%)
District Champion	Plus 1 Power Point
District Runner-up	Plus .5 Power Points
  2. A school's power rating shall be the total points of games played divided by the total games played during the regular season.
  3. Once the number has been decided, if a team was the District Champion then ONE POWER POINT will be added to their total score and if a team was the District Runner-up ONE-HALF POWER POINT will be added to their total score.
  4. Contest played against out-of-state opponents, sub-varsity opponents, Hall of Fame games, and district playoff (tie-breaker) shall not count in determining a school's power rating.

**11.8 SEEDING**

**11.8.1** *In Classes 5A, 4A, 3A, 2A, 1A, and B, all teams shall be seeded (1-32) according to their power ranking. In Class C, all teams shall be seeded (1-28) according to their power ranking.*

**11.8.2** Schools that fail to play **18** games during the regular season, including district play and invitational tournament play, shall be ranked separately using the same ranking system that is used to rank schools that played at least **18** games or more during the regular season.

**11.8.3** For both girls' and boys', classes 1A-5A schools shall count any only those wins on Class B and/or C schools beginning with the 20<sup>th</sup> calendar week.

**11.8.4** Schools that are classified as B and C schools shall count all games played.

**11.8.5** After schools are ranked, they shall be seeded from the highest to lowest against the highest to lowest seeded teams that have played at least **18** games or more during the regular season.

**11.8.6** Schools shall be ranked, seeded, and paired for the state playoffs in the following manners:

1 vs. 32	5 vs. 28	9 vs. 24	13 vs. 20
2 vs. 31	6 vs. 27	10 vs. 23	14 vs. 19
3 vs. 30	7 vs. 26	11 vs. 22	15 vs. 18

**11.8.7** *The seeding for the 28-team bracket shall be as follows:*

**11.8.8** Tie breaking procedures to be used when two or more schools have the same power rating:

1. If two schools are tied and played each other during the season, the school that won the most games against the other school shall be the higher seeded team.
2. If after applying the first criterion and the tie is not broken or if the two schools did not play each other during the season, or if there are more than two schools involved in a tie, the tie shall be broken by applying class play percentage (schools that were played in the individual school's classification). The school with the higher percentage shall be the higher seeded team.
3. If after applying the second criterion and the tie is not broken, the school with the highest won-loss percent in district play shall be the higher seeded team.
4. If after applying the third criterion and the tie is not broken, the school with the highest won-loss percentage in overall regular season play shall be the higher seeded team.
5. If a tie still remains, the higher seeded team shall be determined by having a "draw" conducted in the LHSAA office by the basketball seeding committee.

## **Section 11-Basketball**

### **11.9 PLAYOFFS**

- 11.9.1** As long as it adheres to the LHSAA constitutional rules and by-laws, each class may adopt its own playoff plan.
- 11.9.2** Unless otherwise adopted by a class, all playoff games shall be played on a “home and away” basis from bi-district through the quarterfinal rounds.
- 11.9.3** Playoff rules, financial arrangements, gymnasium selection criteria, and other provisions that do not conflict with the LHSAA’s general playoff rules may be adopted by individual classes.
- 11.9.4** In setting its own financial arrangements, a class shall not prescribe fees, allotments and expenses that are less than or in conflict with the LHSAA’s general financial agreements.
- 11.9.5** In “home and away” games, both schools shall mutually agree on the playing time of the contest. If an agreement cannot be reached, the starting time shall be 7:00 p.m.
- 11.9.6** The earliest date that a bi-district state playoff contest may be played in all classifications shall be the day after the deadline for naming district playoff representatives. Schools found to be in violation of this rule shall be required to replay the contest provided the winner of the bi-district contest has not played its regional contest.
- 11.9.7** In all rounds of playoff games, the Officials’ Association will be assigned by the LHSAA’s Director of Officials.
- 11.9.8** During a state playoff game, both schools shall mutually agree before a play-by-play account of the game can be transmitted by a radio broadcast, a telecast or over the internet.
- 11.9.9** The LHSAA shall mail a state playoff memorandum, a team roster form, and other information to each playoff school. The team roster form shall be accurately completed and returned to the LHSAA by the stated deadline for inclusion in the official tournament program. Failure to return the team roster form on time may result in the school being fined.
- 11.9.10** The winning school in each playoff round shall report the game results to the LHSAA by telephoning immediately after the game. Collect calls shall not be accepted.

### **11.10 DETERMINING THE HOME TEAM**

- 11.10.1** Two playoff schools may, by mutual agreement, reverse the game site. A reversal of the home/away site for any reason shall not affect the criteria cited in Rules 11.10.2, 11.10.3, and 11.10.4.
- 11.10.2 Bi-district Round of Play**
1. In all classes, the higher seeded team shall be the home team.
  2. A “bye” shall be counted as a home game
- 11.10.3 Regional Round of Play**
1. In all classes, any team that drew a “bye” in the bi-district round shall be the home team.
  2. In all classes, the team that traveled in the bi-district round shall be the home team unless Rule 11.10.3.1 applies.
  3. If both teams traveled or were home teams in the bi-district round, the higher seeded team shall be the home team.
- 11.10.4 Quarterfinal Round of Play**
1. The team that has traveled more in the bi-district and regional rounds shall be the home team.
  2. If both teams have traveled the same number of times in the first two rounds, the team that traveled last shall be the home team.
  3. If both teams have traveled the same number of times and both teams traveled or both teams were home teams in the regional round, the higher seeded team shall be the home team.
- 11.10.5** At the state championships, the higher seeded team shall be the home team.

**11.11 PLAYOFF DATES (*all classes*)** - Refer to Rule 11.1, Important Dates for specific playoff dates.

### **11.12 STATE TOURNAMENTS** (Effective July 2011 for the 2011-12 School Year)

- 11.12.1** Both boys’ and girls’ state tournaments shall be conducted at the same sites. The LHSAA Executive Committee shall select the sites for both the semi-final and final rounds of the tournaments. The tournaments shall be held at the selected sites on the dates cited in Rule 11.1, Important Dates, in this section.
- 11.12.2** The LHSAA shall organize, administer, and shall set the tournament-playing schedule for both tournaments.

**11.12.3** The tournaments shall consist of semi-final and final rounds. The semi-final rounds shall be played at three different regional sites and the final rounds shall be conducted at one selected site. Semi-final teams shall be assigned to a regional site by the LHSAA administrative staff. Teams will be assigned to the regional sites based on geographical location of the school from the selected site. Every attempt shall be made to assign the higher ranked team to the regional site closest to the location of the school.

**11.12.4** The LHSAA shall assign all state tournament officials who shall be from a neutral association and, if possible, shall be “certified” or “approved.”

**11.12.5** The LHSAA shall schedule a workout session for each team at the tournament site on the day it plays in the semi-finals and, if possible, another workout session prior to the championship finals.

**11.12.6** On the day each team plays, the LHSAA shall issue a maximum 18 passes to a team and a maximum **12** passes to its uniformed cheerleaders.

**11.12.7** Each participating school shall receive 15 tournament patches at the event and may purchase additional patches after the tournament. The initial 15 tournament patches’ cost shall be deducted from the team’s guarantee.

**11.12.8** From tournament ticket sales receipts, participating teams shall receive a financial guarantee: \$900 per game played and \$5 per mile (*map mileage, one way*). Teams playing two games shall receive mileage for two trips regardless of whether they travel or stay overnight.

**11.12.9** If the LHSAA realizes financial loss after the following expenses have been paid, the loss shall be deducted on a pro-rata basis from the participating team guarantees.

- 1. Coliseum rental
- 2. Coliseum staffing and game administration charges
- 3. Contest officiating fees
- 4. Five percent of gross ticket sales to the LHSAA
- 5. Team travel expenses

**11.13 CLASS 5A ADOPTED PLAYOFF PLANS (Financial and Other Arrangements)**

**11.13.1** The home team is responsible for providing and for the expense for the following (*if applicable*):

- 1. Tickets
- 2. Ticket Sellers and Takers
- 3. Door Guards
- 4. Official Scorekeepers
- 5. Official Timer
- 6. Scoreboard Operator
- 7. Uniformed Security
- 8. Custodial Personnel
- 9. Other Personnel, as needed
- 10. Other items, as needed

**11.13.2** Home team retains rights to concession sales

**11.13.3** Home and away games shall be set by mutual agreement of the participating schools as long as it does not conflict with applicable LHSAA rules. Admission price shall be a **minimum** of \$2.

**11.13.4** Class 5A shall allot 20 complimentary passes that shall be distributed for each game to coaches, players, and cheerleaders in uniforms of both schools.

**11.13.5** The following deductions are used when disbursing revenue received from gross ticket receipts, to include tickets sold in advance and at gate:

- 1. Payment of 5 percent of gross ticket receipts to LHSAA before deductions
- 2. Travel payment to visiting team, if applicable. \$1.00 a mile (*one way, map mileage*) *Team must travel at least 25 miles (map mileage) to game site to be eligible for travel pay.*
- 3. Travel payment to home team, if applicable. \$1.00 a mile (*one way, map mileage*) *Team must travel at least 25 miles (map mileage) to game site to be eligible for travel pay.*
- 4. Payment to contest officials, including official timer.
- 5. Payment for facility rental, if applicable. Both teams share equally in charge for renting playing facility.
- 6. All remaining revenue after the above payments shall be shared equally by both schools.

- 2. Payment to contest officials, including official timer
- 3. Payment for facility rental, if applicable

- 11.13.7** All boys' and girls' playoff games (*from the bi-district round through the quarterfinal round*) shall be played in the home team's gym if it meets the following minimum seating capacity of **1,000** seats. The following shall be used in determining seating capacity:
1. For bleachers, pews and bench-type seating – 18 linear inches per person.
  2. For chair-type seating, capacity will be total number of such type seats.
  3. No moveable chairs may be placed for fan seating nor may such be used to expand seating capacity.
  4. Standing room may not be used to determine seating capacity.

**11.19.1** A school shall not conduct spring basketball practice.

**11.20** **SUMMER ACTIVITIES**

**11.20.1** The coach of a school team may conduct practice sessions during summer months. However, the school team shall not participate in games against other schools or other teams when using the school's name, wearing the school's uniforms, or using the school's equipment.

**11.21** **OFFICIALS:** Rules regarding basketball officials and officiating in general are cited in the By-laws in Section 8.
